Literacy:

We will be spending the remainder of the year working on our farm unit. We will be learning about some of the animals you see on a traditional farm and we will be making a farm of our own at the end of the year. We will also be reviewing our skills that we have worked so hard on this year.

Our treasure book for this week is The Thing That Bothered Farmer Brown. Brown's battle with a mosquito is told in toe-tapping verse in this delightful story based on a classic theme. The farmer who cannot sleep tries to kill a bothersome insect and each attempt disturbs more and more animals on the farm, "But the thing exhausting Farmer Brown was something flying round and round with a tiny, whiny, humming sound." Finally the house is quiet, the farmer is asleep...and readers see the pesky critter now annoying the animals in the barn. Ask your child to tell you about his/her favorite part!

Math:
